The big news: we are going on a European Tour the summer of 1981! Gordon Bloom, our Tour-Manager, has taken the term off to put together a spectacular itinerary, a copy of which is enclosed. Gordon is headed to Europe in December to follow up concert leads. In the meantime, he is devising ingenious ways to raise the \$27,000 that we need. What Else Is Happening?

THE NEW RECORD: "Kroks at Symphony Hall." It is a recording of the spring jamboree of 1980, supplemented by a few studio cuts. And it is late! To the one-hundred or so of you who have records on order, please accept my apologies for the delay. The record company is having production difficulties, but the record should arrive any day now. For those of you who are interested, we will send you one for a mere six dollars.

THE SCHEDULE: Here are some dates that you might want to set aside.

THE YALE GAME CONCERT and RECEPTION on NOVEMBER 22. The Kroks of 1981 invite and encourage you to attend a "Krokodilo reception" in the theater of the Hasty Pudding Club directly after the game. We will be performing at the Pudding immediately following the reception and at Lowell House at 8 P.M. the same evening.

THE WOOLSEY CONCERT at YALE on NOVEMBER 15. Once again, the Kroks will join with the Whiffs in our annual fall performance at Yale.

THE SPRING JAMBOREE on APRIL 3 at SANDERS THEATER. The Kroks will host the Whiffs in our annual spring performance at Harvard.

THE KROKS and KUUMBA in CONCERT. Presently in the works, this would be a joint concert given for the benefit of the community by the Kroks and Harvard's leading black singing group. Probable dates are: February 6, 7,8 or March 13, 14, 15.

THE 35TH REUNION of the HARVARD KROKODILOES. We are planning a banquet which will most probably coincide with our April 3rd Spring Jamboree or possibly with gduation. It all depends on when you can make it. You can expect more information and a questionnaire in the months to come.

HISTORY AND MEMORABILIA:Since its our 35th reunion, we have decided to compile as much information about the Kroks over the years as possible. We have had good luck sifting through the old files, but we need your help.For instance, does anyone have a collection of all the Kroks' old records? If so we'd like to record them. How about old Krok ties? Do they still exist? Finnally, does anyone know the significance of the 1964 needlepoint which reads: "Krokodiloes Nobarf, No Trou!!" Initiation rules, perhaps? These and equally tantalizing questions will no doubt be answered by the time reunionrolls around.
